

How I spent my vacation By Dave Hoadley

I don't remember having to write one of these in elementary school, so this is my big chance!

On my desk, I have a picture frame with photos on both sides. One side is Martin Luther King, Jr., and the other side is former president Jimmy Carter. During the vacation Cathy and I took at the end of February, targeting beach time someplace warm, those two images intersected.

We decided on Georgia for a few reasons, including the many unanimously glowing comments I've heard about Savannah, and we each chose a "must-do" experience. Mine was to drive to Plains to visit whatever was available to honor Mr. Carter.


Cathy found Sapalo Island, one of a chain of barrier islands off the Georgia coast. Before we left, Cathy made specific reservations for a tour of Sapalo Island, but otherwise our time was flexible.

Our first stop was Mr. Carter's boyhood farm, now a National Historical Park managed by the National Park Service. We were able to freely wander around the property and walk through the house that Earl Carter obtained in 1928. The furnishings are replicas, but we got a realistic taste of their lifestyle. Among other buildings on the farm was the home of a Black couple, Rachel and Jack Clark. Jack was the foreman of Earl Carter's farmworkers, and Rachel became a sort of surrogate mother to young Jimmy when his parents were busy working. Jimmy spent a lot of time in their house, which was sparsely furnished and insulated with newspaper.

Archeologists say Sapalo Island had an Indigenous population as far back as 2,000BCE. In the 1800s, most of the island was owned by Thomas Spaulding, who "gradually developed Sapelo into an antebellum plantation empire." (New Georgia Encyclopedia) and had 385 slaves. When abolition arrived, many of the freed slaves gradually began buying tracts of land on the island, and to this day, most of the approximately three dozen permanent residents are descendants of Spalding's slaves. To tour the island, you either have to be invited by a permanent resident or take the tours offered by the State of Georgia. The University of Georgia has a Marine Institute on the island to study the ecosystem of the area.

Our flight home from Atlanta was an early one, so we drove back to Atlanta the day before. That allowed us to visit the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historical Park, also managed by the Park Service. We toured the exhibits and watched a short film that added some details about the civil rights movement that history books tend to gloss over. We also got a long lesson from a Park Service employee at Fire Station 6, one of the park's historic buildings. Like many young boys, MLK spent a lot of time at the fire station talking to the firemen (all men until 1977), and the guide said it's where MLK was first exposed to segregation and racism, as it was 1963 before the fire department hired its first Black firefighters.

We did see beautiful Savannah and got some ocean time at nearby Tybee Beach. Locals were already planning for St. Patrick's Day, since Savannah has the oldest and second largest St. Patrick's Day parade in the nation. And we had time to relax and enjoy delicious local restaurants, so it was a very successful vacation!




